

NANCY'S NOTES...

“THIS IS MY SON, WHOM I HAVE CHOSEN; LISTEN TO HIM”— GOD’S MARCHING ORDERS (LUKE 9:28-36)

The Transfiguration is one of several supernatural manifestations by which God authenticates Jesus as his Son: angels at this birth, angels at his resurrection, the descent of the Holy Spirit at his baptism. In the story recorded in Luke 9:28, Jesus has gone up the mountain to pray and seek the approval of his Father, before his entrance into Jerusalem to lay down his life. He takes his three most trusted “inner circle” disciples - Peter, James and John, who will eventually bear witness to the event. Who should they meet on the mountain but Moses and Elijah, the chief law-giver and the chief prophet, signifying Jesus as the fulfillment of “all the law and the prophets.” Scripture says that the appearance of Jesus’ face changes, and his clothes become “as bright as a flash of lightning,” reminiscent of the glowing of Moses’ face, after he has met God on the mountain to receive the Ten Commandments. The highlight of the encounter is the very voice of God from the cloud that comes to envelop all of them: “This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him!”



Who is God addressing in this story? Certainly not Moses, nor Elijah, for why would they need such instruction? Not Jesus, either, because he’s talking *about* Jesus, not *to* him. So, that leaves the disciples: Peter, James and John; and, it leaves us—you and me. What clearer instruction could there be, what clearer marching orders could we have from God than this—*Jesus is my Son! I have chosen him! Listen to him!*

Unfortunately, in today’s world, we’re tempted daily to listen to just about everybody *except* Jesus! Space-age technologies in mass communication make this more true than ever before. Even within Christ’s holy church, we’re hearing alien voices that lull us and woo us to all kinds of heresies and twisted theologies. There are those who would trick us into thinking that scriptures are no longer relevant to today’s issues, and that Jesus is just *a way*, and not necessarily *the way* to the Father, as Jesus himself so definitely told us (John 14:6).

Here at St. Barnabas, and here in the Diocese of Central Florida, we are blessed to still be hearing the Word of God preached and taught and practiced in accordance with Holy Scriptures. We are richly blessed to have Fr. Don Lyon as our Rector, and John W. Howe as our Bishop, two Godly men who can be thoroughly entrusted with our spiritual guidance. It has long been my goal to model after them. We all need to make it our business to share the good news in our community that Jesus is Head of St. Barnabas and of our Diocese, and that this is a place to dwell in safety under God’s mighty hand.

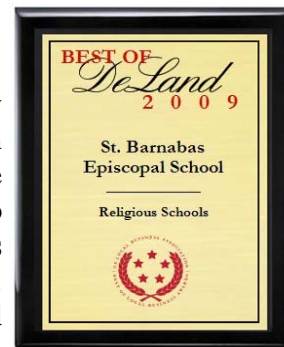

In Matthew 25:34-46 Christ speaks quite clearly with regards to the judgment, "When did you come to me when I was sick and in prison?" In verse 40 Jesus says, "Truly I say to you, to the extent that you did it to one of these brothers of mine, even the least of them, you did it to me." Well, we are not all called to go into the prisons and to minister to the incarcerated, are we? But I am here to tell you, that there are many ways that we who have been called, can take you in with us to help us bestow the love, mercy, forgiveness, and light of Christ upon those who are the least, the last and the lost.

At our daycare center, white placemats can be turned into life changing expressions of Christ's love with a few words and a picture drawn with crayons that has a child's first name and age on it-I've seen it bring hardened inmates to tears. We will even provide the placemats. During the weekend we go through over a 1,000 dozen cookies, you see they don't allow wine and hosts, so the manna from heaven takes on a little different essence, some of them could be provided by our congregation or school, both Publix and Winn-Dixie have 2 for one sales all the time. If placemats or cookies are not your forte, you could help to offset the cost of the weekend and help to maintain this International ministry by making a donation to Kairos, it is tax deductible. Typical cost for a weekend is from 3-\$5000.00, in most cases this is absorbed by the team that does the weekend and also from all the love and donations of others who are not called into the prisons. Our next weekend takes place at the Work Camp at Tomoka on the 24-27 of September, the Theme is "Forgiven and Free." FAM NITE TO FEATURE BISHOP'S EVANGELISM TEACHING— FALL PROGRAM BEGINS WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 9TH

The lead-off **FAM Nite** program for adults this fall at St. Barnabas will be an excellent new DVD series recorded in February this past spring at the Canterbury Retreat and Conference Center. Our Diocesan Evangelism Commission produced the video, and each church in our diocese has received copies to share within their congregations. The weekend Lenten retreat with Bishop John W. Howe was entitled, "How to Give Away Your Faith: Sharing the Gospel on a Personal Level." The video with the same title has four sessions - *The Right Motive*, *The Right Message*, *The Right Method* and *The Right Model* - which will be presented over a four-week period beginning with the first FAM Nite on **Wednesday, September 9th**. Following our pattern from last season, the programs will be repeated on Sunday mornings in Canterbury House between the 9 a.m. and the 11 a.m. services. A short discussion time will follow each video session.

FAM (Family All-ages Ministry) Nite begins each Wednesday (starting Sept. 9) with covered dish dinner in the Harwood Center at 5:30, followed by adult programs in the church and other locations, and children's programs in the Harwood Center. Nursery care is included, and everything wraps up by 7:30.

By telling your unique story, you are helping to heal yourself and bring hope and comfort to others who have walked where you have and have experienced and survived the tragedy of suicide. There is never pressure to talk or participate until you are ready. Survivors who have experienced the pain and trauma associated with their loss can help offer a supportive atmosphere in which to safely discuss all aspects of their loss, the emotions, hurt, guilt and unanswered question of "why". There are no fees for attending this support group.

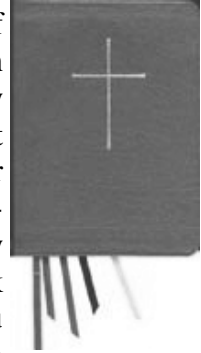

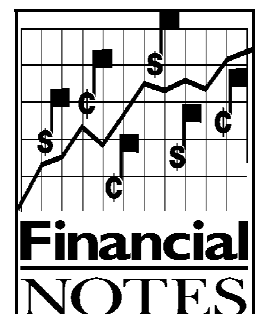
